GUEST SPEAKER - MIKE DEVEREUX

Mike's very entertaining and informative address was (as usual) given off the cuff, so it is difficult to report the full detail of what he covered, but Neil's abbreviated summary of the salient points follows.

Firstly, Holden is adapting to major changes in the way they do business. Holden has signed an Engineering Services Agreement with our GM China partners, PATAC, to provide expertise in defined engineering areas. PATAC is a 50-50 joint venture between GM and Shanghai Automotive Industry Corp (SAIC). The long-term partnership will see a Holden team drive the development of at least two new vehicles for the world's largest car market. The team will develop the new vehicles, which will be underpinned by GM global platforms, and tailor them for the Chinese market. However, the biggest concern for the future is here at home: the government's Auto Policy position on-going. It should also be noted that the exchange rate for the Australian dollar has doubled against the US dollar since 2005.

It should also be recognised that of the G20 countries, only one does not have a car industry – Saudi Arabiaand they are anxious to change that.

Early in the year, Mike and Prime Minister Gillard announced a co-investment venture with GM committing to investing more than \$1 billion in local manufacturing to secure Holden's Victorian and South Australian-based operations until at least 2022, following \$275 million government assistance.


"Holden does not sell high technology cars"

- The Volt went on sale early this year, with the US Ambassador to Australia, His Excellency Jeffrey Bleich, becoming the first Australian customer for the car. Since then, the Volt has sold forty cars in thirty days! This is compared with the competitors' cars which in total sold only forty seven cars in a whole year! So, it is clear that if the true facts are presented, Holden is well placed to continue to be a force in the Australian Auto industry, provided the Government of the day recognises the importance of the industry to Australia and gives it the support it deserves.

2012 New Products and New Technology

Mike then moved on to talking about new and upcoming products.

o The Colorado Ute is proving very popular since its launch in mid-year and was in the top ten vehicle sales. o Now released Colorado 7 is generating great reviews and attracting interest among 4WD users.





o The Volt is also smashing sales records for electric vehicles, with the major sales feature being the relief from 'Range anxiety" which is a real concern for many customers. Sales of 40 cars in 30 days are evidence of the appeal of this car.

2013 A Growing Portfolio

o Coming up is a new Barina, our small car entrant. Apart from the normal update features, the Barina will introduce 'MyLink' a new Infotainment system which will interface with the driver's Smart phone features.



In particular, it will introduce 'Pandora' which is a free, internet based system to store your favourite music "in the cloud". It will also include an updated GPS system. Pandora is certain to be a very attractive feature amongst the younger buyers, who are the major Barina market.

Other releases coming up include the following cars:

- o A new Barina Spark five door hatch with the introduction of its first automatic transmission. Available early in 2013, the updated Barina Spark will be offered in CD auto and CD manual versions.
- o Trax, a five seat SUV model, smaller than Captiva.
- o An imported Cruze Sportwagon variant, available in two models, CD with the choice of two engines,
- a 1.8 litre petrol engine or a 2.0 litre turbo diesel, or the premium CDX with a 1.8 litre petrol engine. This will be imported as the complexity at Elizabeth Plant will not allow for additional models to be introduced they already handle more than 45 vehicle variants down the line!
- o Malibu (mid-size Camry/Honda fighter). Malibu has a 2.4 litre DOHC petrol engine or an optional 2.0 litre common rail turbo diesel powertrain, with a six speed Auto Transmission with Active Select.





o The top line Chevrolet SS performance sedan based on the VF Commodore will be built in Elizabeth plant and exported to the US. A new Nascar Team for 2013 will use the Chevy SS, a return to Rear Wheel Drive for the sport. Thus, GM will again offer a 'Win on Sunday, Buy on Monday" car.

Mike then took a number of questions from the floor, including such things as (very abbreviated):

- Why do Toyota have a bigger range of models than Holden (theirs is a RHD source, so almost every vehicle produced by their parent is available for Australia)
- What do the vendors need to do to survive (build innovative, high volume products for high volume models, Can't sell widgets,)
- Does importing cars hurt local car sales (people will buy the car they want. If we do not offer the type/size of car they want they will go elsewhere rather than change their buying intention.)

Mike and Matt had to leave for a meeting elsewhere. John Leigh proposed a vote of thanks to Mike for his presentation, and for the support that Holden continues to give our club.

John continued the normal meeting business including the introduction of new members.

Frank Pound took the podium and delivered several entertaining yarns in his inimitable style. Then followed the door prize raffle drawing, with the host of prizes donated by Holden. The meeting concluded with many members gathering to view the Colorado 7 and Cruze Sportwagon that Corporate Affairs had brought along for our viewing.

We recently heard of the death of Chuck Chapman an ex Holden Managing Director. Below is an obituary published by the Canyon Courier which summarises his life and achievements well.

OBITUARY

Charles Sherman Chapman (1926 - 2012)

Obituary

Charles Sherman Chapman was born in Duluth, Minn., in 1926. His family was of modest means during the Great Depression, and he started working from a young age. He later remarked that he earned the money to buy all the clothes he ever owned starting when he was a teenager. Because of his family's difficult circumstances, Mr. Chapman attended four different high schools in Minnesota and Michigan. In 1943, on the day after his graduation from high school, he joined the U.S. Marines, and he served as a corporal in the battle of Iwo Jima against the Japanese in early 1945, working in radar and communications. He was preparing for the invasion of Japan when the atomic bomb was dropped and World War II ended. He was discharged in 1946. Upon arriving home, he attended college at the University of Detroit and Wayne State University in Detroit on the G.I. Bill while also working. A few months after beginning college, he met Mary Elizabeth Carleton, and in 1948 they were married. He graduated summa cum laud from Wayne State with his bachelor of science degree in industrial engineering in 1950 and went on to get his master of automotive engineering from the Chrysler Institute of Engineering in 1952. He continued to take night engineering and business classes for the next 14 years, earning a master's of business administration from Michigan State in 1966, and accumulating the equivalent of a second masters of engineering. In 1956 he joined the Buick Motor Division of General Motors, working in the design and development of automatic transmissions. In his 11 years as an engineer at Buick, he earned eight patents related to transmissions and braking systems. During his time at Buick, he received regular promotions, eventually becoming assistant chief engineer. In 1967 he moved with his wife and five children to Frankfurt, West Germany, where he was chief engineer for General Motors' Opel division through 1975. During some of those years, Opel was the best-selling car company in Germany, outselling even Volkswagen. In 1976 he moved to Melbourne, Australia, where he served as managing director of the General Motors Holdens (GM-H) car company until he retired in 1988. At retirement, he was a vice president of General Motors, in charge of Australia, New Zealand and

Southeast Asia. Upon retiring, he and his wife moved to Evergreen.

Mary died in 1993 after several years of suffering from cancer. In 1994, he married Delores Spinzig. Mr. Chapman was an easy person to be with. He was humorous, generous, friendly, positive, caring and smart. He was also active athletically throughout his life, working out regularly each morning, skiing into his 70s, and he was a lifelong golfer. He is survived by his wife, Delores; his five children, Steve, Sally, Joe, Bill and Sue; three stepchildren, Susan, Jeff and Barbara; ten grandchildren, six step-grandchildren; two great-grandchildren; and one great-step grandchild.

TREASURER'S REPORT 2012.:-

I am pleased to report another strong result for the Holden Retiree's Club for the 2012 financial year (Jan – Dec). At year end, we have \$4,000 in a Term Deposit, and a sum of \$3,912 available to run the Club in 2013, and to make donations to charity.

Our club is non-profit making, so all surplus funds are donated to charity. In early 2013 we will be able to make donations totalling \$2,500 to five charities, our highest total ever. Our previous record was last year, when we donated \$2,000 to charity. This will still leave us with around \$1,400 to cover the Club's expenses during the year, which should be quite adequate to cover all foreseeable items. Plus we normally get further subscriptions early in the new year.

Again this year, we have deemed it prudent to put aside reserves of \$1,500 in a Term Deposit to guard against any unforeseen issues during the coming year. In addition, we have \$2,500 in the Term Deposit protecting forward subscription payments.

At year end, the Club has 542 financial members, with a further 95 on the books but yet to pay their subscriptions for 2013. Direct Deposit has become easily the most favoured way to pay subs, with the number of EFT payers almost equalling the Cheque and Cash payment totals together.

Our transition to The Mulgrave Club as our meeting venue has gone very smoothly, with many positive comments received from members. Those who have not yet been to the new premises would be most welcome to come and see for themselves the improvement in our meeting facilities. In summary, 2013 promises to be another strong year for the Club.
