GUEST SPEAKER:-

Our Speaker for 03 September, 15 was Ian McCleave.

His subject was: By MG from Cape To Cairo and beyond!



After graduating from Monash in Mech Engineering, Ian joined Holden where he worked in a range of Engineering roles. He led the Product Development team responsible for Holden's expansion into 4 cylinder engine exports and then moved on to become Program Manager for the locally manufactured Holden Vectra. From 2001 until he retired in 2007 he was Executive Director for Product Planning and Program Management. Since leaving Holden he has consulted on several alternative energy projects for auto industry companies and also consulted on Land 121 Defence Projects.

From 2010 - 2014 Ian was CEO of EV Engineering, an industry consortium which successfully designed and built a 'proof-of-concept' fleet of fully electric vehicles based on the Holden Commodore.

Ian also served as Vice President of the Holden Retirees Club for three years from 2009.

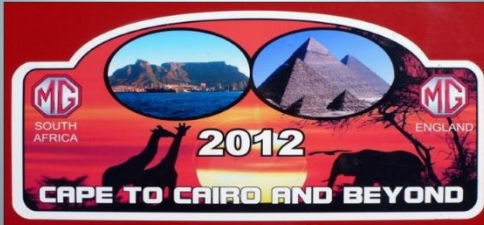
Summary:

GUEST SPEAKER - Christmas Meeting - 03 December 15:-

Mark Bernhard – Managing Director - Holden



Mark Bernhard was vice president and chief financial officer of Shanghai GM in Shanghai, China, a position he has held since November 2011 prior to taking up his current role at Holden. He was also a member of the GM-SAIC joint venture's Executive Committee. Mark began his GM career with GM Holden in 1986, holding various positions in the Finance function. He relocated to Zurich, Switzerland, in 1996 as Manager of Budgets and Consolidation for the then GM International Operations. In 1998, Mark was appointed Director of Financial Reporting and Analysis for GM International Operations in Detroit. Two years later, he took on the role of Director of Special Projects at GM Asia Pacific in Singapore, working on the acquisition of Daewoo Motor Company. In 2002, Mark became Vice President and Chief Financial Officer of Shanghai GM. He was appointed Chief Financial Officer of the GM China Group in 2005. He returned to Australia in 2007 as CFO and Executive Director of Finance for GM Holden, navigating the global financial crisis. Mark has a

Bachelor of Business (accounting) degree from Monash University, as well as a Master's degree in Business Administration from Deakin University. He is an FCPA with CPA Australia and a graduate of the Australian Institute of Company Directors (AICD). Mark received the Silver Magnolia Award from the Shanghai Municipal Government, which is given to expatriates for their contribution to the economic development of the city. He also received the 2014 Australia China Alumni Award for Banking.

This will be This will be Mark's first visit to an HRC lunch meeting. Mark will provide an overview of his perceptions at Holden.
